

December 2018- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 106 incidents for the month of December 2018, compared to 82 incidents in December 2017. Firefighters have responded to 1042 calls so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 211.88 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 186.83 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 398.71 hours responding to incidents in December 2018.
- Personnel spent 49.25 hours attending meetings and 116.93 hours in training sessions during the month of December 2018.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 1787.89 hours since January 1, 2018 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
