

# ***April 2019- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report***

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 109 incidents for the month of April 2019, compared to 59 incidents in April 2018. Firefighters have responded to 385 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 201.78 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 286.91 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 488.69 hours responding to incidents in April 2019.
- Personnel spent 36 hours attending meetings and 278.75 hours in training sessions during the month of April 2019.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 2722.41 hours since January 1, 2019 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
