

May 2020 - Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 102 incidents for the month of May 2020, compared to 115 incidents in May 2019. Firefighters have responded to 512 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 303.94 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 262.66 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 566.6 hours responding to incidents in May 2020.
- Personnel spent 59 hours in training sessions during the month of May 2020. Regular Wednesday night meetings for the department were cancelled due to COVID 19.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 3599.08 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
