Food – Corner Cupboard Grocery and Nutrition Center: The HCFS Corner Cupboard is a grocery store. Each client is provided with a shopping list with quantities based on family size, the ages of the family members, and special dietary needs. Each client is greeted by staff and volunteers, and guided through the produce section, demonstration kitchen and aisles of healthy food. Discussions revolve around nutrition, portion sizes, label reading and meal planning.

Financial Assistance: Families in crisis find themselves unable to pay for the simplest of things: prescriptions, rent, food and utilities.

Clothes and Household Goods – Random Hangers: Random Hangers, the HCFS retail and resale store, has two main missions: 1) to provide no-cost clothing and household goods to qualified applicants who have a demonstrated need, and 2) to conduct retail sales for

clothing, accessories and household goods, with all revenue supporting HCFS client programs.

Case Management: HCFS offers case management by identifying the crisis and helping individuals and families create a plan for individual self sufficiency. By assessing a client's condition and circumstances, case managers use the information to address short and long-term challenges.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: HCFS thoroughly evaluates clients who request financial assistance. Our review includes an assessment of spending for the past 90 days, proof of income, bills and debt. Qualified clients can receive help with water and electrical bills, medical co-pays, prescription co-pays and rent.

Human trafficking involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act. Every year, millions of men, women, and children are trafficked worldwide – including right here in the United States. It can happen in any community and victims can be any age, race, gender, or nationality. Traffickers might use violence, manipulation, or false promises of well-paying jobs or romantic relationships to lure victims into trafficking situations.

Language barriers, fear of their traffickers, and/or fear of law enforcement frequently keep victims from seeking help, making human trafficking a hidden crime.

Traffickers use force, fraud, or coercion to lure their victims and force them into labor or commercial sexual exploitation. They look for people who are susceptible for a variety of reasons, including psychological or emotional vulnerability, economic hardship, lack of a social safety net, natural disasters, or political instability. The trauma caused by the traffickers can be so great that many may not identify themselves as victims or ask for help, even in highly public settings.

Must exhaust all other assistance program benefits, including medical insurance, Victims of Crime benefits if applicable, V.A. benefits, etc., before qualifying for indigent health assistance.

COVERED BENEFITS: Medical bills including hospital, physician bills, prescriptions (3 per month), lab work and radiology. Services must be performed by or under the direction of an M.D. or D.O. Does not cover eye exams, glasses, or dental.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: County resident, household composition, income and resources, 21 years of age, below Federal Poverty Level.

Our office provides medically needed health assistance to those who meet the income, resources, residency, and household composition: those who are 21% of poverty income level or below a household who has less total countable household resources not exceeding \$3,000 when a person living in the home is aged or has disabilities and they meet relationship requirements under \$2,000 in total countable resources for all other households residents of Kendall County.

The program is also available to undocumented persons who meet eligibility requirements. Verifying documentation/proof of income and resources must be provided to assist the department in determining eligibility. The process can take two weeks to complete once all required documentation is received.

Applicants are not eligible for indigent health care benefits if they are eligible for any other Federal, State, or private benefits. For example, Medicaid, Medicare, VA, CHIPS or other insurance.

Indigent Health Care is, by law, the payer of last resort, and all other resources must be explored first (when medically appropriate to do so).

FUNDED BY: The Kendall County Indigent Health Care Program (CIHCP) is a state mandated program administered by the County. Program rules and eligibility standards are set by the State of Texas.
