

June 2020 – Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 109 incidents for the month of June 2020, compared to 92 incidents in June 2019. Firefighters have responded to 621 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 168.37 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 190.66 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 359.03 hours responding to incidents in June 2020.
- Personnel spent 348.66 hours in training sessions and 23 hours attending Wednesday night meetings during the month of June 2020. Due to COVID only one regular meeting was held in June.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 4395.09 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
