

# September 2020 - Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 114 incidents for the month of September 2020, compared to 104 incidents in September 2019. Firefighters have responded to 959 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 156.64 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 138.03 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 294.67 hours responding to incidents in September 2020.
- Personnel spent 67.25 hours in training sessions during the month of September 2020. Due to COVID, regular Wednesday night meetings have been held by Zoom.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 6122.88 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
