

# October 2020 – Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 149 incidents for the month of October 2020, compared to 132 incidents in October 2019. Firefighters have responded to 1108 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 257.87 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 210.02 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 467.89 hours.
- Personnel spent 136.63 hours in training sessions and 21 hours in departmental meetings held by Zoom during the month of October 2020 .
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 7000.56 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
