

# MAY 2021 – BOERNE FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 177 incidents for the month of May 2021, compared to 102 incidents in May 2020. Firefighters have responded to 902 incidents so far this year.
- Firefighters spent 299.98 man hours responding to incidents inside the City limits and 138.01 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 437.99 hours responding to incidents in May 2021.
- Firefighters spent 27.5 hours in meetings and 111.15 hours in training session in May 2021. Personnel also spent 242 hours participating in the annual Fish Fry Fundraiser.
- Firefighters have spent a total of 4176.56 hours since January 1, 2021 responding to incidents, attending meetings / training sessions, and participating in extra activities.
