

JULY 2022 – BOERNE FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 171 incidents for the month of July 2022, compared to 185 incidents in July 2021. Firefighters have responded to a total of 1146 incidents this year.
- Firefighters spent 352.17 man hours responding to incidents inside the City limits and 311.44 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 663.61 hours responding to incidents in July 2022.
- Firefighters spent 29.25 hours in meetings 114.75 hours in training sessions in July 2022.
- Firefighters have spent a total of 7648.92 hours since January 1, 2022 responding to incidents, attending meetings / training sessions, logging volunteer station hours and participating in extra activities.
