

FEBRUARY 2023 – BOERNE FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 169 incidents for the month of February 2023, compared to 151 incidents in February 2022. Firefighters responded to a total of 363 incidents this year.
- Firefighters spent 622.47 man hours responding to incidents inside the City limits and 315.8 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 938.27 hours responding to incidents in February 2023.
- Firefighters spent 12.50 hours in meetings and 257.62 hours in training sessions in February 2023.
- Firefighters have spent a total of 2928.77 hours since January 1, 2023 responding to incidents, attending meetings / training sessions, logging volunteer station hours and participating in extra activities.
